

Under the law, schools must monitor attendance of students and follow up unexplained absences with parents and caregivers. Your child must attend school **ALL** school days unless you have a reasonable excuse. You must not keep your child away from school for minor reasons. Education Queensland policy is that all student absences must be accounted for. Parents/guardians must telephone the school or provide a written note explaining the reason for absence, emails should be addressed office@edgehillss.eq.edu.au
A record is made of your call and all notes are kept on file. Unexplained absences are marked accordingly. Teachers or administrators will contact families where children are absent without explanation.



First Aid/Medication

First Aid

Members of our school staff are permitted only to render basic First Aid. This is immediate, temporary treatment given by the staff in case of an accident. Should medical treatment beyond First Aid be required, parents are notified immediately whenever possible and/or the necessary treatment arranged. In case of a serious accident, an ambulance will be called to transport the injured child to a doctor or hospital.

Administration of Medications

All medication to be taken by children at school should be brought to the School Administration Office to be administered under the supervision of the Administration team. Parents must bring medication to the office and complete the 'Permission to Administer Medication'.

Please note, school staff will only administer medication that:

- has been prescribed by a qualified health practitioner (e.g. doctor, dentist)
- is in its original container
- has an attached pharmacy label

All medication **must be labelled** in the name of the child with a pharmacy prescribed label. This includes; cough medicines, Ventolin and Aspirin, Disprin, eardrops etc. No medicines can be accepted without a completed 'Permission to Administer Medication' authorisation from the parents/guardian. *Non-prescribed oral medications (such as Panadol) should not be brought to school and will not be administered by any staff.*

Parents are to advise the School Administration Office of details of any children who self-administer approved medication. e.g., medications for Asthma, Diabetes and Epilepsy.



Information for medical specialists

If your child is seeing an external specialist who requests that the school or teacher provide information or complete an assessment for your child please follow the steps below.

- 1. Please provide the request for information/assessment in writing to the Deputy Principal for Learning and Inclusion Mrs Kirsty Edwards kedwa51@eq.edu.au. Please do not contact the class teacher directly.
- 2. Please provide the following details:
 - Name and specialty of the provider seeking the information
 - Email address and phone number of the specialist seeking the information
 - Date of appointment or date that information is required. Please allow a minimum of two week's notice.
- 3. Before providing information to the specialist, the school will require you to complete and return a *consent* form for sharing of information with external providers
- 4. If the specialist requires the school/teacher to complete an online form or assessment, the school will provide you with a *third-party website consent form* which must be also be completed and signed. Please note that the school is required to keep a copy of any information provided via a third-party website.
- 5. Please note that any requested information is provided directly to the requesting specialist.

Fige Hill Start Wobile phones and smart watches

Edge Hill is a **device free school** and mobile phones should not be brought to school. In the case of walking or riding to school and parents require their child to have one for safety, mobile phones must stay in school bags at all times, until the student is **off school grounds**.

Mobile phones must be turned off upon entering the school premises and not turned on until after 3:00pm dismissal. Failure to comply with this expectation can result in the phone being taken and parents to collect from the office.

Smart watches must be set to school mode during the school day. The school is not responsible for damage or theft of mobile phones or smart watches that are brought to school.

The Qld government has now imposed a full ban which commenced in Term 1 2024 – mobile phones to be 'away for the day'.

Reporting

While our classroom teachers are available to discuss your child's progress throughout the school year, there are key times of year when we formally report to parents:

Parent/Teacher Interviews — twice per year (end of term 1 or beginning term 2) (end of term 3 or beginning of term 4)

Teachers are available for prearranged, individual meetings with parents and their child to discuss the student's individual achievement and learning needs. Your teacher will send home a preference form for you to fill in prior to the interviews and advise you of your time. Please ensure you note the day and time and be prompt for this meeting.

Student Reports – twice per year (end of term 2 & 4)

Formal reporting is completed for all students in late June and early December each year. Report cards are emailed home in the last week of the school term.

Year 6 Term 1 Curriculum

<u>English</u> – students will analyse poems and songs with social, cultural or historical contexts and will share their ideas in an oral presentation.

<u>Maths</u> – students will work with whole number concepts, including integers, operations, problem solving, space and transformations, and data and statistics.

<u>Science</u> – students will explore reversible and irreversible changes of solids, liquids and gases and conduct fair tests.

<u>HASS</u> – students will examine Australia in the 20th Century, focussing on citizenship and Federation.



Music –Miss Curtis and Mrs Hogan

- 2 x 30- minute classroom lessons a week.
- Students will learn choral technique and musical responding terminology through singing. They will also continue to grow their musical theory knowledge of note values and names.
- Students perform using vocals, untuned, and tuned percussion instruments such as glockenspiels, ukuleles, guitars and keyboards.
- Composing by writing rhythms and melodies on the stave.
- Responding to music involves students being audience members listening to, enjoying, reflecting on, analysing, appreciating and evaluating their own and others' musical works.
- 1 x A4 music workbook on the booklist covers Year 5 and Year 6.
- Instrumental lesson timetables can be found on the M block music room windows.
- Ms Alannah Bowen will teach woodwind, Mrs Maureen Cameron Brass, Mr Simon McMenamin Violin/Viola, Ms Angela MacKenzie cello/ double bass and Mr Jonathon Barbagallo percussion.
- All teachers will be in touch regarding lesson times/day and ensemble days. All ensembles rehearse before school 7.45am-8.45am and will be working towards performances in school, and the Cairns and District Junior Eisteddfod in Week 10, Term 2.
- For all instrumental students please ensure a contract has been completed and students arrive with all required equipment.



Music continued –Miss Curtis and Mrs Hogan

Students are invited to join our Senior choirs known as Bel Canto (Beautiful singing) and Dolce Canto (Sweet singing).

All students interested in joining the choir are invited to come to rehearsal during Weeks 2 and 3 in M block music room 7.45am-8.45am on Wednesday mornings. From Week 4 students will be placed into our 2 senior choirs to rehearse for the semester towards our performances and competitions.

Dolce Canto rehearse every Wednesday afternoon 3.15-4.15pm in M block and Bel Canto rehearse every Wednesday morning 7.45am-8.45am in M block. Students and families are required to sign a choir contract to show commitment for the semester. These will be handed out during rehearsals from Week 4.

Health and Physical Education — Mr Ashton

Throughout 2025 in Year 6, students will focus on undertaking a wide range of health and physical activities. Students will be engaged in participating, practicing & applying movement skills, This is achieved through a variety of learning experiences, individual, small & whole group activities. These activities will also focus on teamwork and cooperation.

For Land-based classes -

- REQUIRED hat, water bottle and appropriate footwear (no gumboots, crocs, thongs etc)
- Girls may be more comfortable in skorts rather than a dress for some activities.

For Pool-based classes (Water Safety)

- REQUIRED togs, sun-safe swim shirt, towel and long hair tied back. Students also need to know how to undress, dry and dress themselves. This is good to practice at home.
- OPTIONAL swimming cap and goggles (please check goggles for correct fit when packing swimming gear)

Health and Physical Education – continued

Term 1

Achievement Standard

In this unit, students will explore the health-related fitness components of a range of physical activities and the importance of physical activity participation to health and wellbeing. They will apply the elements of movement to compose and perform a fitness activity station that develops a health-related fitness component. Students also discuss the impact regular participation can have on health and wellbeing

Fitness Fun

Achievement Standard

In this unit, students practise specialised movement skills involved in the WSSEProgram including entries, exits, survival skills, survival strokes & rescues and apply them in a variety of movement sequences and situations in water.

Water Safety Swimming Education Program (WSSEP)

Term 2

Achievement Standard

Students demonstrate fair play and skills to work collaboratively. They perform specialised movement skills and sequences and propose and combine movement concepts and strategies to achieve movement outcomes and solve movement challenges. Students apply social and personal skills to demonstrate fair play and work collaboratively in activities and games

Invasion Games Unit – Eg. Tchoukball

Achievement Standard

In this unit, students investigate how physical activity creates opportunities for different groups to work together. Students identify how physical activity contributes to individual and community wellbeing. Students collect information on physical activity participation in their school setting and explore how technology can support participation in physical activity.

Visiting Students

Currently EHSS runs a Japan Study tour for Year 5 and Year 6 students every second year. We anticipate that our next trip will be in September 2026. Student selection for this this trip may commence in term 4.





Awards of Excellence Year 5/6

To Support Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) in year 5/6 we run a program called the Awards of Excellence. This is to acknowledge students who consistently display positive qualities that reflect the Edge Hill Expectations of Learners are Respectful, Responsible and Safe. They demonstrate these qualities in all areas of their lives including in the classroom, the school and the wider community. They act as exemplary role models for peers and younger students. These awards are promoted at the beginning of each year and referred to throughout the year by all stakeholders.

The program commences in Year 5 and continues into Year 6 with students having the opportunity to achieve, Bronze (Year 5), Silver and Gold (Year 6). Points are accumulative and carry forward to the next term/year

GOLD - 120 POINTS PLUS 6 OCRB POINTS
